### Where in the World Is Kim Jong-un?

Korea. For several weeks, nobody outside of North Korea knew where he was. This led some to wonder if Kim might be sick or in isolation to avoid COVID-19.

North Korea is a country of 25.5 million people that borders China and South Korea. Most Western nations see North Korea as a **dictatorship**, with Kim as its absolute leader.

North Korea has been developing nuclear weapons and is believed to have succeeded. It is also developing missiles to allow it to launch its weapons into other countries. This has caused great concern for South Korea. There have also been tensions between North Korea and other countries, who have condemned North Korea for trying to develop nuclear weapons.

The Korean War ended in 1953, splitting Korea into North and South. No official peace treaty has ever been signed and the border between the two countries remains one of the most militarized in the world.

As a result, the health and whereabouts of North Korea's leader is of interest around the world.

After a public appearance on April 11, Kim was not seen for several weeks. He missed planned public events, including the celebration of his late grandfather's birthday on April 15. Even for North Korea, which is very secretive, this was unusual.

The 36-year old Kim has

a family history of heart problems. One rumour is that he had heart surgery. Another said the surgery was on his ankle. One report suggested Kim might be ill from this surgery.

During North Korea's **May Day** celebrations on May 1, Supreme Leader Kim finally made a reappearance. North Korean **state media** showed pictures of Kim laughing. **A**


